Jeffrey Jr commutes between the forest and playground, but the commutes grow longer as he ventures deeper into the forest. He marches with purpose along the pathways in and out of the areas. Jeffrey Jr only seems to return to the playground to check in and make sure that he isn't missing out on anything. He may not climb too high into the trees, only around 10 metres, but he is a strong climber and can cover some great distances. His climbing technique may look chaotic to us as he swings back and forth, his arms and legs akimbo, but Jeffrey Jr knows what he is doing.

In the forest Jeffrey Jr occupies himself foraging for fruit and water. He feasts on the roots of orchid-like plants, medicinal fruit, and young stems. Wild orangutans have an impressive dietary memory bank as they eat more than 400 different types of food. As long as Jeffrey Jr keeps this up, he will be an expert in no time.
